On comes Busted and plays defensive stuff to ease his way in. The next bowler is Big Jim Chipmunk famous for his barbies at Townsend LTC. He bowls a few pies allowing the SADDOS to up the run rate. Busted retires, which opens the door for the debut innings of Imogen and Sophie. Both have good technique and are able batters, but Alvin's bowlers who promised to ease up on the bowling (tut tut!!) didn't and unfortunately the girls were not able to make inroads into the run chase.
