Crabtree v SADS - Rothamstead Park 2020-08-04

Crabtree Win by 14 runs

Crabtree usually edge this fixture and in the early August Rothamstead twilight the SADS came up short once again, this time by a mere 14 runs.

Given SADS strength in numbers it was surprisingly difficult to get a full team available for this one, so we had to cast the net wide and blood two debutants, the rookie Junior Bottom and veteran Anthony Rowland. There was also an emergency callout to Mini (not so mini) Churchie.

Crabtree won the toss and elected to bat.

Jonesy, the SADS captain asked Churchie Jr & Sr to open the bowling. Tidy bowling from Churchie Jr, keeping it tight and putting the openers under pressure with figures of 2-1-6-0. At the pavilion end Sr takes the first wicket, Robbo gathering a straightforward catch at midwicket. Next up is debutant Junior Bottom, partnering Bondi, bowling good line and length with decent figures of 2-0-7-0. Bondi, comes on and off again (?) with his second over replaced with Churchie Sr. Crabtree, frontloaded their top order with some strong batsmen and peppered the boundary. The match ball went AWOL and as there was no spare (?) had to be replaced with a sorry looking practice ball.

Nighters and Anthony Rowland (the other debutant) are the next SADS bowling partnership. Nighters takes a wicket first ball, Churchie Sr taking the catch this time.....but the boundary fielders are still seeing plenty of action. I'm not sure if Anthony Rowland is related to Kevin of Dexy's fame, but there is plenty of running going on in his allotted 2 overs. In fact, some comedy fielding worthy of a seasoned SAD is also very much in evidence.....he slips to the left he slips to the right..... Anthony don't forget your cricket boots next time!!!

The double act of Jonesy and CRS are next up. Both take a wicket, Robbo taking a classic diving catch on the boundary from CRS. Jonesy is now one away from a half century of SADS wickets...he will have to wait though! Robbo is unlucky not to get a hat trick of catches as he spills a difficult chance from just inside the boundary. CRS is also no balled (believe it or not!) when he takes an excellent caught & bowled. Sometime during the 14-16th over, the sorry looking practice ball is retired when the original match ball is eventually found in the hedgerow.

The final bowling pair of Robbo and Busted take two wickets each and a there are a couple of run outs in Robbos over to bowl out Crabtree for a total of 144.
